Dr. Gian Singh Mann



Our new Principal, Dr. Gian Singh Mann, is a prodigious and prolific literary genuis who shines with singular scintillation on the academic horizon of the state. That he would rise to such eminence was evident from his early student career at Govt. College, Ludhiana, where he won College Colour for Co-curricular Activities and excelled as a debater. At Ram Garhia College, Phagwara, he earned the prestigious Roll Of Honour in Academics. He had his post-graduation in Hindi and English and Ph. D. from Punjab University. But he obtained his post-doctoral research degree, D. Litt, from Bihar University. During the past twenty four years of his teaching career, he has moulded the minds of innumerable alumni, some of whom are now occupying very high echelons of administration.

His flair for writing has found expression in more than three dozen books, not to mention the steady flow of articles and research papers from his fertile pen. His penmanship has earned him two National Awards and four State Awards for Novel, Epic, Drama and Stage respectively, besides a Gold Medal for Literature.

He presented papers on Indian Culture in Paris and Cambridge in 1978. He has made 20 appearances on TV, participated in 15 National Conferences and has delivered 90 extension lectures on Indian Culture, Astrology, Yoga, Divinity, Literature, Theatre etc.

He is happily married to Mrs. Veena Gian Singh, a lady of wit and charm, and is blessed with a son. Anubhav.

A PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Mohindra College, Patiala, owes its existence to the munificence and philanthropic zeal of H.H. Maharaja Mohindra Singh who ascended the throne of Patiala at the tender age of ten and left his impress on the educational life of the state by creating this magnificent institution during the short span of 24-years of his eventful existence. His highness invited His Excellency Lord Northbrook, the then Viceroy of India, who laid the foundation stone of this grand structure on 30th March, 1875. Its foundation was laid in accordance with the Hindu custom of placing an image of Shesh Nag at the base to propitiate the deity and the European custom of placing some coins in the foundation was also observed. The building was completed in about ten years and on 17th March, 1884, Lord Ripon, Viceroy of India, performed the opening ceremony of the college. In his brilliant address His Excellency hailed it as a 'magnificent architectural monument' and complimented His Highness Maharaja Mohindra Singh who had spent more than Rs. 5,000,00/- (a stupendous amount in those days), on its construction. The institution has played a stellar role in shaping the destinies of its countless alumni for well over a century.

At the time of its inception, it was the only institution of its kind in the vast area stretching from Lahore to Delhi.

Apart from its architectural grandeur which reflects a fine synthesis of Oriental and Occidental styles, the college attracted students from far and wide and occupied a place of preeminence in the educational landscape of the country. The gift of free education to all and the tradition of secular education made it very popular with all sections of society and eminent scholars drawn from all disciplines gave it the prestige and popularity which it still enjoys. Though initially it was intended to impart instruction in Sanskrit, Persian and Arabic, the teaching of English and Mathematics was added shortly afterwards and the college was affiliated to Calcutta University.

In 1880, Intermediate classes were started and in 1887 the college was raised to B.A.

standard of Punjab University, in commemoration of the 50th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria. Postgraduation in Mathematics was started in 1912 and in the same year the first meeting of the Old Students Association was held under the chairmanship of Principal E. Candler. The F.Sc. classes were started in 1920 and in 1922, during the tenure of Principal Manmohan, Postgraduation in Philosophy was introduced.

The credit for publishing the first college magazine The Mahendra and staging Shakespearian plays goes to Prof. K. K. Mukherjee in the 1920s. His Highness Maharaja Bhupindra Singh highly commended the performances.

Till 1930, no fee was charged from students. However, a sum of Rs. 04/- p.m. began to be charged from non-subjects of Patiala in 1931.

The college was affiliated to Punjabi University in 1962.

At present, the college imparts instruction in Postgraduate Courses in History, Economics, Pol. Science, Hindi & Punjabi, besides the under-graduate courses in Science, and Arts.

It deserves mention that Justice R. S. Sarkaria and Shri Jagan Nath Kaushal are among the illustrious alumni of the college. Similarly, Dr. S. Radhakrishanana, Shri Jai Parkash Narayana, Mrs. Tarakeshwari Sinha, E. M. Forster, Shri Buta Singh and His Excellency Shri S.S. Ray are some of the distinguished personalities who have paid a visit to this college.

Eminent educationists including Principal E. Candler, Principal (Sadhu) T.L. Vasvani, Dr. G.L. Bakhshi, Dr. Bhagat Singh, S. Gurusewak Singh, S. Harbakhsh Singh and Dr. Jogindar Singh have preceded the present and 23rd Principal, Dr. Gian Singh Mann (D. Litt), who has won National Awards from the Govt. of India twice and is an author of more than three dozen books.
