### Our New Patron

Dr. Raj Kumar Sharma, who took over the reins of office on 31st October 2001, is a poised, pleasing and popular Principal of Govt. Mohindra College, Patiala.

Born on 25th April 1947 in village Shamaspur, near Amloh,

he had learnt the magic mantra of academic excellence from his father, Shri Brahmanand even before completing Matriculation from Govt. High School, Amloh, in 1962. Subsequently he graduated in commerce from Govt. Bikram College of Commerce, Patiala, in 1966 and obtained the degree of M.Com. from the Dept. of Commerce & Management, Punjab University, Chandigarh in 1968.

He made his debut as a teacher at S.A. Jain College, Ambala City, in 1968. Soon, however, he was selected for his permanent job as a lecturer by the PPSC as well as the HPSC but he opted for the Punjab Education Service. In 1969, he started his career at Govt. Rajindra College, Bathinda where he served for nearly a decade. In 1979 he came to Govt. Bikram College of Commerce where he established his credentials as a renowned teacher of commerce. During his long stay of about two decades at Bikram College of Commerce, he gained in stature & self esteem and blossomed into an author of 25 books. He did his LL.B. in the Evening College of Punjabi University in 1984 and also got Ph.D on 'Industrial Entrepreneurship in Punjab' in 1987. Eventually he emerged as a dynamic and forceful leader and served with distinction as General Secretary of GCTA Punjab.

He embarked on his administrative career on Ist February 1999 as Principal, Govt. Ripudaman College Nabha and served there upto 31st May 2000. From 1st June 2000 to 31st July 2000 he guided the destiny of Govt. College of Physical Education Patiala. On 1st Aug. 2000 he took over as Principal of Bikram College of Commerce, Patiala with which he had association both as a student and as a teacher.

During his Principalship of Mohindra College he has, in a short time, given ample proof of his warm cordial relations with all sections of the college staff and students. His charismatic leadership, his realistic assessment of men and matters and his positive, pragmatic and proactive approach have transformerd this 127-year old institution into a vibrant organisation running smoothly like a well-oiled machine.

## OUR OUTGOING PATRONS

#### Prof. S.S. Chohan

Born on 2nd October 1942, Principal S.S. Chohan had a long innings as Principal, beginning with Govt. Guru Nanak College, Guru Teg Bahadurgarh, Dist. Moga 1984. Thereafter, he served at Govt. Ripudaman College, Nabha; Govt. Bikram College of



Commerce, Patiala, 1998-1992; Govt. College Gurdaspur; Govt. College of Education, Patiala, 1992-1997; and Govt. College of Phy. Education Patiala, 1997-2000. He remained Principal of Govt. Mohindra College from June 1, 2000 to 31st Oct. 2000.

During his teaching and administrative career, he remained a member of the Board of Studies in Economics, Commerce and Education, Punjabi University, Patiala. He remained member of the Selection Committee of the Languages Dept. Punjab and acted as Adviser to the P.P.S.C. and the U.P.S.C. several times. He was elected President of Punjab Govt. College Principals' Association. He also remained Member of the Academic Council of N.I.S., Patiala. He represented the state of Punjab in the World Council for Curriculum and Instructions held at Pollamkati, Tamil Nadu and presided overs a session of the conference.

### Dr. Vidwan Singh Soni

Born on 26th October 1943, Dr. Vidwan Singh Soni achieved international name & fame as a physicist by virtue of his historic detection of an error in the American Nobel Laureate Michelson's epoch-making 'Michelson- Morley Experiment.



His Doctoral and post-Doctoral researches have earned laudatory references in International journals. In response to various invitations from abroad, he visited the USA, the U.K., China, Pakistan and many other countries. He has to his credit a number of books in English and Punjabi, some of them in translation. No wonder, he won the Shiromani Lekhak Award of Punjab, 1990; Dr. Hargobind Khorana Award, 1994-95; Dr M.S. Randhawa Award, 1996; and National Children Literature Award on a book in Punjabi.

Another brilliant aspect of his research is Palaeontology. He has held exhibitions of the fossils collected by him from time to time at various places: Govt. Museum, Chandigarh, 1993; Punjabi Bhavan, Ludhiana, 1994; Delhi Zoo, 1996l; Archaeological Survey of India Hall, Chandigarh, 1997; and Govt. Mohindra College Patiala, 2000.

### SYMPOSIUM ON PROBLEMS AND PROSPECTS OF THE PUNJABI YOUTH

Building strong character of the youth, understanding religion, cultivating discipline, diligence, respect for elders and generating employment opportunities for the youth, will go a long way in stemming the tide of unrest among the youth", said Mr. Tejinderpal Singh Sandhu, Chairman, Punjab Subordinate Services Selection Board, while speaking at a symposium on Problems and Prospects of Punjabi Youth held under the aegis of Old Students' Association of Govt. Mohindra College. Mr. Sandhu also announced a grant of Rs. 1 Lac out of the Jasdev Singh Sandhu Memorial Fund for the renovation of the dining hall of the college hostel.

Presiding over the symposium, Mr. Surjit Singh Rakhra, Syndic, Punjabi University, urged upon the teachers to create awareness among the youth about the changing socio-cultural and economic scenario of the world. He stressed the need for creating more opportunities of employment for the youth. He exhorted the youth to work with dedication like their counterparts abroad for building their careers. He also announced a grant of Rs. 1 Lac for the OSA.

In his welcome address, Dr. Vidwan Singh Soni, Principal of the College, stressed the need for harnessing the vital human resources of the country to ensure a bright future for the younger generation.

Initiating the symposium, Prof. S.C. Sharma underlined the need for releasing the creative potential of the youth by providing them fora for self-expression. The O.S.A., he said, would act as a bridge between the youth and the authorities for creating a healthy and meaningful interaction between them. The Punjabi youth are not 'useless', they are 'used less', he averred.

In his keynote address Prof. C.S. Virk, Head, Postgraduate Department of English of the College,

viewed the problem of the punjabi youth in the post-modern perspective which recognizes the identity of classes, sub-classes ad infinitum and thus demolishes the monolithic structure of society. He blamed the media, the new wave of information technology and the lack of role models in society and politics for the moral degradation of the younger generation. He strongly pleaded for the restoration of time-honoured values to save the youth from the morass of moral chaos.

Viewing the whole scenario in the economic perspective, Dr. R.S. Ghuman of Punjabi University pointed to the growing population, faulty models of development and the demonstration effect as the causes for the problems of the Punjabi Youth.

Prof. Indu Dogra of Govt. College for Girls, urged upon the government to create more opportunities for the youth and exhorted the younger generation to imbibe moral values from the rich cultural heritage of India.

Participating in the ensuing discussion, Dr. N.K. Dogra pointed to the lack of will and sincerity on the part of the leaders to solve the problems. Dr. Asa Singh stressed the need for controlling population which is the mother of all problems. Dr. B.S. Pannu pleaded for simplifying the procedure and format for applications for jobs and entrance tests in Punjab. Dr. Sangeeta Handa sought clarification regarding the peculiarity of the punjabi youth vis - a - vis the youth of India.
